From Fr Colin

It was good to be able to celebrate and live stream the Eucharist from the Lady Chapel in church on Wednesday. It felt, for me, more authentic. I am grateful for the many positive comments I have received. I know how much it has been appreciated that we can join together as a virtual community, although sadly we are not all able to receive the sacrament.



At the moment, the government plans to allow places of worship to reopen at the beginning of July, provided there isn't a second wave of the Coronavirus before then. It is possible that churches might be open for private prayer before then, and on Friday 15th May faith leaders will be meeting with government ministers to discuss this. Even if they do, whether it is July or earlier, there are likely to be continued restrictions in terms of social distancing and hand washing. It is possible that we might need to restrict numbers for our 10 AM Sunday Eucharist, perhaps having an additional service so that everyone who would like to come are able. The Church Wardens and I will be giving consideration to this over the coming weeks so that when we are allowed to open, we will be ready. Some of you might still be in a position where you will need to self-isolate and so we are considering the possibility of continuing live streaming. In fact, I have already begun to discuss with the wardens whether it might be a good idea to continue to live stream our Sunday Eucharist on a permanent basis as many churches (particularly those from a more charismatic tradition) have done for some years. This current crisis has revealed that many people are crying out for spiritual guidance, support and solace. Churches who do live stream have found that many more people are participating in the services than normally go to church. There is potentially an important area of mission here that it would be remiss to ignore. Your thoughts regarding this would be greatly appreciated. Clearly, we need to consider any legal hurdles that we might need to overcome and would want to discuss this further with the PCC in due course.

I hope you are all continuing to stay safe and well.
