Welcome from the Chairman....

Welcome to Waterlooville Music Festival 2016. The aim of this week is to bring music into St. George's Church and into the centre of Waterlooville, for the whole community to enjoy. Together with Waterlooville Business Association's "Market Place Music" on the first day of the Festival, you are invited to over 50 concerts, featuring soloists, choirs, instrumental groups and orchestras. This year we have an exceptionally strong programme line-up, the difficulty is deciding what to miss out on rather than what to come and see!

Our local schools have a huge pool of musical talent, and this can be enjoyed with various concerts where students are performing at lunchtimes and in the afternoons. This year we are offering local schools a workshop featuring the Harp, and a lunchtime concert by harpist Danielle Clark is one of many highlights.

Opening the evening line up is the Havant Borough Council gala concert which takes us back to the 1940's dance halls with the Langstone Big Band including a Vera Lynn Tribute by Jill Langford. On Sunday the Festival Scratch Choir will have a lovely programme of Gilbert and Sullivan Choruses and are joined by Paul Pilott, Louise Helyer and Friends delivering a complete performance of **Trial by Jury.** Monday brings us one of the region's most accomplished symphonic youth bands, The Highbury Area Band. Tuesday is Folk and Ale Night with, by popular demand, the return of the sell-out line up last year: Revel Weird and Wild + Portsmouth Shantymen. On Wednesday we are delighted that, after a gap of six years, we have managed to book **The** Hampshire Police Male Voice Choir, founded 1941 and celebrating their 75th anniversary this year. On Thursday a unique opportunity for a Waterlooville audience to enjoy a professional male harmony group with a huge following who are normally to be found starring on major cruise ships and at holiday centres - The Octaves are flying in from Genoa to be with us, and thereafter are off performing on P&O Ventura and Cunard's Queen Elizabeth - see video clips of them on the festival website. Friday is 50's to 80's Party Night and another festival first with one of the UK's leading Everly Brothers Tribute acts The Foreverly **Brothers.**

And of course the festival concludes as ever with **Last Night of the Proms** which I'm afraid was more or less sold out two weeks after the box office opened in February - any late returns will be offered during the evening concerts. Throughout the week refreshments will be served and each evening, except Monday, there is a wine and real ale bar with cask beers supplied by one of our local breweries, Bowman's. Tickets for all the evening concerts are set at very reasonable prices and, with the exception of Saturdays, include an interval drink from the bar. But remember that the festival is on all day, and there are many daytime events of a professional standard to enjoy, all of which are free of charge. An **Organ Recital** on Monday, **Baroque Ad Hoc** on Tuesday, Jazz with **Robbie Rich** on Wednesday, a Harp Recital Thursday, Palm Court tea dance with **Cornish Cream Teas** served on Friday, and the talent of local rock bands with **Bands on the Lawn** on Saturday.

The Festival Organisers are greatly indebted to local businesses and councils for their continued support, without which Waterlooville Music Festival could not continue. The individual sponsors are listed at the end of this programme, but special appreciation is given to AllMobility of Waterlooville, Keys Newsagents of Highfield Parade and Thistle Wool Shop in Cowplain all of which have hosted the Festival Ticket Offices. Please support them and the other sponsors whenever possible. As usual Havant Borough Council has been a great supporter of Waterlooville Music Festival and the organisers express their appreciation. Stay Local has donated free advertising space, and we are grateful.

Thank you for coming to this year's Waterlooville Music Festival. All the monies taken during the week go towards the cost of staging the Festival - both this year and next. In 2017 the Festival will be June 10th -18th and the programme is already being compiled. Anyone can join the Festival Scratch Choir. There is an application form on the Waterlooville Music Festival website, or contact Jane Rice-Oxley on 02392 263576. Members of the Festival Scratch Choir must purchase a ticket for the evening (or a Passport ticket) and attend the rehearsal on Sunday 12th June at 4pm, and the performance at 7.30pm.

A wonderfully light, enjoyable and amusing evening with some great classics from one of the greatest and most successful composer/lyricist partnerships, music that continues to entertain and have a huge following now just as it did back in the Victorian era.

Paul Pilott Louise Helyer and Friends have been giving concerts together since 2011, performing a varied repertoire which includes Gilbert and Sullivan, Opera, Oratorio, Folk Songs and Songs from Broadway and the West End.

Trial by Jury

In 1874, Gilbert wrote a short libretto on commission from producer–conductor Carl Rosa, whose wife would have played the leading role, but her death in childbirth cancelled the project. Not long afterwards, Richard D'Oyly Carte was managing the Royalty Theatre, and he needed a short opera to be played as an afterpiece to Offenbach's La Périchole. Gilbert already had available the libretto he had written for Rosa, and Carte suggested that Sullivan write the score. The composer was delighted with it, and Trial by Jury was composed in a matter of weeks. First performed at The Royalty Theatre London on 25 March 1875, with Sullivan's brother, Fred, as the Learned Judge, the opera was a runaway hit, outlasting the run of La Périchole. Provincial tours and productions at other theatres quickly followed.



David Cain is Director of Music at St. Mary's Church Portchester where he is responsible for organising the music for a growing number of services together with a small and talented choir who enjoy a very varied diet of church music from choral evensong to praise bands. He is also the long standing Musical Director of the Hayling Island Choir, a large dedicated group of singers who enjoy a wide range of repertoire. The choir are equally at home singing Faure's Requiem, Gilbert & Sullivan or Rudolph the Red-nosed Reindeer!

David is an honours graduate from the Open University gaining his BA and Diploma in Music in 1998 and MA in Music in 2012. Amongst David's other musical commitments he is currently secretary of the City of Portsmouth and District Organists' Association.



Paul Pilott LRAM ARCO is Organist and Director of Music at St. Mary's Alverstoke. In addition to his wide experience in Choral Music as conductor and accompanist, Paul has acted as Musical Director for many Theatre Productions and Shows. He also teaches in local schools and privately.

Paul is a Licentiate of the Royal Academy of Music and an Associate of the Royal College of Organists.



Louise Helyer has recently acted as Musical Director for Portsmouth Players in 'A Little Night Music' and for CCADS in 'Road Show', both very challenging works by Stephen Sondheim. She has forthcoming MD engagements well into 2016 including 'Cats' and 'Into the Woods'. She has also written and produced her own show 'The Code of Love', which was performed at Thorngate Theatre Gosport and Station Theatre Hayling Island, to wide acclaim.

RODERICK STARR- Organ Recital

Roderick studied the organ under Isadore Harvey and later general music under Ernest Stride and David Squibb in Kent when he joined the Royal Marines School of Music and from where he developed as a composer and conductor. He went on to become a Bandmaster and a Director of Music. He studied harmony and composition under Michael Hurd and later 20th Century composition with Martin Ellerby.

He has been commissioned to compose works ranging from Christmas carols to large symphonic pieces. Roderick is a Licentiate of the Royal Academy of Music in conducting. He holds a Masters Degree in 20th Century Composition and is a Fellow of the Incorporated Society of Musicians. In October 2015 Roderick was appointed as Director of Music at St George's Church, Waterlooville.

HIGHBURY AREA BAND



The Highbury Area Band is a symphonic youth wind band with an extensive repertoire covering the whole musical range including classical, popular, marches, film themes and music from well known shows. The musicians range in standard from Grade 5 upwards, and are mostly aged between 11 and 21, although there are some older members who enjoy themselves so much that they cannot bring themselves to leave!

The Band has grown from a small ensemble of wind players who attended Highbury Junior School in Portsmouth to their current status as one of the most accomplished symphonic youth wind bands in Hampshire with members drawn from a number of schools and colleges in South East Hampshire.

Their last appearance at the Waterlooville Music Festival was in 2012, when they outsold all other concerts that year except the Last Night, and the evening itself was electrifying, with a fantastic programme of popular music and a thrilling performance.

Richard Horn, Musical Director

Richard Horn started his involvement with the Highbury Area Band in 1997 playing the Euphonium, after spending seven years in the Portchester and Fareham Area Youth Brass Band and two years in a local orchestra playing French Horn. In 2002 Richard was asked to become band leader for HAB, a position which he held for four years. In 2001 he was invited to form the Big Band section of HAB and whilst running this Richard's conducting impressed the musical director Steve Tanner and after a few years he was invited to take rehearsals when Steve was unavailable.

Richard's first concert "in charge" of the band was at the Waterlooville Music Festival 2007.

In 2010 Steve Tanner stood down as Musical Director after 21 years of service, and Richard was appointed Musical Director of the Highbury Area Band in September 2010.

Hampshire's Leading Male Voice Choir - On the Beat



In 1941 Portsmouth was subjected to intense attack from the air. Officers of the Portsmouth City Police together with War Reserve and Special Constabulary colleagues were called upon to add civil defence and emergency duties to their conventional police ones. Many hours were spent on stand-by between air-raid alerts and Sgt F T (Tommy) Holland saw a chance, when the men harmonised, of roping in the best of them to form the nucleus of a choir. It gradually improved to such a standard that the Chief Constable approved the formal establishment of the Portsmouth City Police Choir. Its first conductor was Special Sergeant (later Inspector) James Cracknell.

Very soon the choir was in demand to raise morale and for fundraising activities in the battered city. Many concerts were given with the Band of HM Royal Marines, then, as now based in the city. Invitations also followed to broadcast on the Home & Overseas programmes of the BBC. This activity continued after the war and included appearances in 'Friday Night is Music Night'. After the rationalisation of police forces in 1967 the choir became the Hampshire Police Choir. Its size has remained at about 60 with serving and retired police officers, special constables, civilian staff and others associated with the service.

The Choir tours the South of England and Europe with recent visits to Bruges and the Rhineland of Germany. It regularly performs at Police publicity events such as Policing through the ages at Gunwharf Quays, Portsmouth, the Force Families Day at Netley Police Training Centre and the naming by Sir Robin Knox Johnstone of the new Force police launches at the Royal Southampton Yacht Club. It is also very proud to support the annual community singing at the Remembrance Day Service at the Portsmouth Guildhall. In 2015, the choir celebrated its 75th Anniversary with a major concert at Ferneham Hall with the Police Band and launched its new CD.

The Choir is in much demand and its busy schedule has led to it being six years now since their last visit to Waterlooville Music Festival - on which occasion, in 2010, the concert was a complete sell out.

DANIELLE CLARK Harp Recital

Danielle grew up in London and studied the harp at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama for three years. Since then she has played in orchestras and theatrical shows and has worked for Cunard providing harp music on their world cruises.
